
Good afternoon,

What a joy to hear the sound of singing around the school this week as the children are practising for our Easter Celebration. Each class is working on retelling part of the Easter story, from Ducklings right up to Eagles.

As Holy Week starts on a high note when Jesus entered Jerusalem on a donkey and the crowds cheered and welcomed him, sometimes we feel that life is going well and we have lots of people cheering us on. Sometimes, like before the Last Supper when Jesus washed his disciples' feet, when we have opportunities to serve and help others. It was with great sadness this week that we learnt of the death of Mrs Sally Thompson - a much-loved former Teaching Assistant and Teacher at Downham.

Every child wanted to be in Mrs Thompson's class and every adult wanted to work alongside her; she radiated warmth, love, understanding and compassion. She took time to notice and support everyone – from the highfliers to the strugglers, recognising that everyone needs a helping hand from time to time. She was a passionate History leader and was always ready to share her knowledge and enthusiasm.

In recent years, Mrs Thompson loved meeting past pupils, parents and grandparents when she was out walking and loved to hear news of pupils she had taught. She kept in touch with many of her former colleagues and was a listening ear and a welcoming hug at the end of many a tough day.

So many in our wider school community are heartbroken by the loss of our dear friend. In the summer term, some of the staff will be raising money for St Luke's Hospice in memory of Mrs Thompson. We hope we can count on your support.

The importance of school attendance. Improving attendance is everyone's business. The barriers to accessing education are wide and complex, both within and beyond the school gates, and are often specific to individual pupils and families. The foundation of securing good attendance is that school is a calm, orderly, safe, and supportive environment where all pupils want to be and are keen and ready to learn. Some pupils find it harder than others to attend school and therefore at all stages of improving attendance, schools and partners should work with pupils and parents to remove any barriers to attendance by building strong and trusting relationships and working together to put the right support in place. Securing good attendance cannot therefore be seen in isolation, and effective practices for improvement will involve close interaction with schools' efforts on curriculum, behaviour, bullying, special educational needs support, pastoral and mental health and wellbeing, and effective use of resources, including pupil premium. It cannot solely be the preserve of a single member of staff, or organisation, it must be a concerted effort across all teaching and nonteaching staff in school, the trust or governing body, the local authority, and other local partners.
