Create a map of London in 1666 showing the location of the River Thames, Pudding Lane bakery and where the fire spread. 	Why not go on an adventure? • Visit Pudding Lane • Climb The Monument 	Imagine you are Thomas Farriner and you have just woken up to find the fire in your bakery. Use your senses to write a diary entry e.g what you can see, hear, smell, feel and taste. 
Create or reproduce a picture depicting a scene from London during the great fire. You could draw, paint, collage, use chalks or use a computer paint package to create your picture. 	Pretend you are a news reporter in 1666. Write a newspaper report. This could be handwritten or typed on the computer. Can you make your newspaper report look old?	Create a model of a Tudor House that would have been involved in the Great Fire of London. 
Create a poster showing rules that we should follow in order to be "Fire Safe". 	Or.... do something else to do with our topic, "The Great Fire of London"	Try baking some bread for your family to try.
