Create an advert persuading people to go to the Ancient Olympics. Research what events would be held and what would happen to include in your advert.	Create an imaginary Greek God. Draw them and give them a name. Can you write a fact file about them? Can you write your own Greek myth with them in it?	Prepare for battle with Athens by creating or designing a Spartan helmet or shield. Can you research fighting tactics that were used and think about the advantages and disadvantages of each one?
Can you create your own A-Z book of Ancient Greece for children to learn more about the subject?	Cook some Greek food as a family or design a Greek menu for a Greek night. Think about what dishes you would include. Can you write the recipes?	Can you learn some simple Greek phrases and teach your family and friends? Can you create a poster to display in class?
Research Pythagoras. Who was he? Why was he important? What impact has he had on life today? Can you present your findings in a fun way?	Can you watch some videos of Greek dancing and choreograph your own dance? You can film it and send it in or perform for the class.	Draw/Paint/Collage a picture of a modern/Ancient Greece landscape
